

### **THE HISTORY OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF *URIMBIRRA*\***

The planning and building of *Urimbirra*, the Rotary Mentally Retarded Person's Residential Centre in Hamner Street Williamstown was the largest project undertaken by the Club.

The project was spread over several years, proving the old adage that Rotary does not finish on the 30<sup>th</sup> June and restart on the 1<sup>st</sup> July each year, at that time of the year when new Rotary office bearers replace the old.

In 1973 the Club decided they should undertake a major project. What was most needed in Williamstown? In the process of investigations, the plight of a young mother with a mentally handicapped child became known to members and led to an approach to the Mental Hygiene Authority to conduct a survey in Williamstown to determine the extent of the problem and the type of accommodation required.

After many months of research and many hours of deliberations, it was finally resolved, that a respite centre for intellectually handicapped people was needed to provide relief for their parents and carers for short periods up to four weeks at a time.

In March 1978, the master plan of the project received approval from the Club's Board of Directors and in April a public meeting was called to form a Benevolent Society and to elect a committee to build and operate the project. Rotary was to provide the funds. The appointed committee comprising Rotarians and specialists in mental health met in May and their constitution was approved by the Health Commission of Victoria in August 1978. Negotiations resulted in the leasing of land from the Victorian Railway. The land was twice the size required so the Club accepted the responsibility to develop the additional area as a park.

## Kergen Angel – Victorian Youth Parliament

Our Guest Speaker today Kergen Angel, a past student of Williamstown High School, approached our Club hoping for financial support in his efforts to put forward a debating team for the next Youth Parliament sessions of July 2018. Kergen, had a placement with the Hobson's Bay City Council last year and sat in Chambers. He found the experience to be inspiring and rewarding. He is passionate about the opportunity to put forward a debate in Parliament in support of a possible Bill; and proud of the various Bills that have been passed in Parliament initiated by Youth Parliamentarians. Kergen has put together a team of equally inspired young people and now needs the funds to make his team a reality at Youth Parliament next year. He is approaching other Clubs in the Hobson Bay precincts, with a similar ethos to us, with the hope of receiving a small monetary contribution. Youth Parliament is designed for young people aged 16 to 25 years. 120 Youth Parliamentarians from all around Victoria sit in Chambers annually putting forward their ideas for Bills. In open discussion with Kergen Damien and Murray were able to enlighten him a little of Rotor Act and the Ryla Camp. Kergen expressed great interest for himself and his Youth Parliamentarian peers, who are looking for such organizations to align their energies and philosophies with. During the time in which the team are debating in Chambers they stay at a camp in Bacchus Marsh and travel to Parliament daily. At the Campsite the Youth Parliamentarians research and toss around ideas for creating change. The environment is relaxed and fun, and fosters confidence and momentum, in a safe and unpretentious setting. Many Bills have been passed in Youth Parliament such as the mandatory safety bicycle helmet. A team of Youth Parliamentarians, with hearing impairment, were successful in their debate of a Bill to assist in the smoother travels of those with such disabilities, on public transport. Many excellent initiatives are born from the Voices of the Youth involved in the annual event of Youth Parliament; and possibly many a young Rotarian!
