Youth programs.

Hundreds of kids have been involved in the Rotary youth programs, but we lose touch with most of them. It has been decided to have an alumni established from this point forward. This will help to give them meaning and purpose to stay connected.

2021 – 100th Anniversary Rotary Australia

The District Committee is asking that all Clubs have a century project to mark the occasion. It is important to plan now.

Membership

Our Club had 72 members, now 22.

This has been a common problem in the District - had 3000, now 2200

What we need to be able to do is to be attractive to new members. Also attractive to people who don't join our Club. We need to attract young people – they want to be involved in projects, this is their focus.

Rotary Clubs worldwide are thinking of innovative membership models to meet the needs of their members and attract new members. One new model that originated in California is a *Passport Club*. Members are local people who want to make a difference in their community in a way that fits within their time, talent and finances, as well as with their family, work and life commitments. Instead of weekly meetings members are encouraged to engage in humanitarian service. A preliminary information session for the PC was held last Saturday at DIK in Footscray. All they have to do is 30 odd hours of community work a year.

Another model getting away from traditional meetings is a Young Mothers Group in Brunswick. These approximately 30 smart, professional women who are interested in Rotary meet for morning-tea on a weekday. They are currently working on EndTrachoma 2020.

Foundation.

Asked how many donate to the Foundation? Everybody encouraged to make a personal contribution to the RF. The Foundation is our public charity helping Rotarians do all its work around the world. 50% of donations come back to our District in 3 years' time to support grants and scholarship. Recognised as the Number One charity in the world, 11 years in a row. 95% of money donated goes to the projects.

World Polio Day

24 October 2019. This is observed every year to honour the birthday of Dr Jonas Salk, who developed the first polio vaccine in the 1950s. Last year 33 cases in the world. 1980s – 350,000 cases a year. So far this year 42 cases.

Thousands of Rotarian Clubs around the world will hold events and fundraisers to recognise Rotary's progress in the global fight to end polio.

To mark the occasion in Melbourne there will be a Polio Train Ride. It's planned that every DG travel into Melbourne from different regions and end up together on the train. DG Grant Hocking will embark in Echuca. AGs will join in. Federation Square will be the convening place. It is envisaged that the event will create great media interest with national TV coverage.

Paul Harris said in 1935 "*The world is a changing place and we must change with it.*"
