The tree was used by Europeans to post messages and share news, while the Boonwurrung conducted formal ceremonies at the site.)

Today it was Eddie, our President, who gave us an excellent PowerPoint presentation. He was born in Williamstown and lived here all his life, married to Rhonda with two sons, Richard and Glenn. His uncle, Bob McLeod, ran the Boot Repair shop at 127 Nelson Place, next to Remvi Restaurant. After his primary and secondary education in Williamstown he went to Footscray institute of Technology where he received a Diploma in Civil Engineering, a Municipal Engineers Certificate and became qualified as a Municipal Building Surveyor.

He served as a Civil Engineer for Melbourne Metropolitan Body of Works in its major sewerage design. He was Civil Engineer for City of Williamstown for 23 years during which time he was appointed Deputy City Engineer. He then continued to City of Hobsons Bay for a further 22 years which included his work as a Municipal Emergency Resource Officer.

He joined Williamstown Rotary in 1987 and was President in 1995/96. He served on the Board in numerous positions – Secretary, Club Service, etc. His most rewarding experience was for District 9800 Rotartank Project in Western Samoa in April/May 1998. Rotartank was a project that provided quality drinking water to remote villages in neighbouring developing countries. He said it was a thrill to see the grateful faces of the community after they saw the fresh water.


