The Club has received notification for applications for the RYPEN PROGRAM. Applications close 9 October. For the newer members RYPEN is a program for 15-17 year old students. Club Constitution

Past District Governance Director David Whiting is working on creating a template so that Clubs can easily update their Club Constitution Rules and By-laws. This will be made available to Clubs for a minimal cost and include all the recent changes passed at the Council on Legislation. Changes can be incorporated to suit Clubs specific needs. It should be ready by the end of August.

Working with Children Checks

A WWC check and the Volunteer Declaration Form are required for all people involved in Youth programs. This is vital that this is completed before they start volunteering with youth. Each Club must have a register of these forms and a copy should also be held at District. The VDF should be renewed when a person's WWCC is renewed. Completed forms should be sent to the District Secretary for secure storage.


