Guest Speaker

John Barry, our Chairperson for the day, introduced Jim Orchard from the Rotary Club of Melbourne who spoke on "Around the Bay in a Day". This is a non-competitive fully supported recreational cycling fundraising event organised by Bicycle Network in Victoria. Cyclists register to ride a course that is 210 kilometres (130 mi) either clockwise or anti-clockwise around Port Phillip Bay, starting and ending in Melbourne, though other distances, both shorter and longer with a 20km and 50km ride are available. The ride raises funds for the Smith Family Charity *Learning for Life* Program.

The Learning for Life sponsorship program recognises that disadvantaged children need extra support to stay at school and go on to further studies or employment. On average, children growing up in disadvantaged homes are two to three years behind their more advantaged peers.

The impacts of poverty are severe and far-reaching. When they start school, many children in disadvantaged families are behind in basic reading and math skills, lacking the essentials they need to fully participate in their education. Without the skills they need to keep up in class, these students can fall even further behind, making it more difficult for them to stay engaged and motivated at school. So when a student is sponsored through The Smith Family, as well as financial assistance with purchasing school essentials, the student's family is also paired with a *Learning for Life* Coordinator. The *Learning for Life* Coordinator offers students encouragement and support with their schooling; links students and their families to learning and mentoring programs in their community and helps children and young people to fully participate in their education.

The Rotary Club of Melbourne has been involved with the ride for several years now and coordinates the 50 km ride from Albert Park across the Westgate Bridge to Williamstown and back to Albert Park, which has become the most popular leg. All funds they raise from the event go straight to the Smith Family Charity. Being involved in the event increases Rotary's profile and they are looking to expand Rotary's involvement. They have 18 marshaling positions to fill and offered them to Williamstown and Yarraville Rotary Clubs.

The funds raised by clubs do not require to be donated to the Smith Family.

The two times for marshaling are a 5.20am start and 8.00am start. A number of members have taken on the marshaling.

An inspirational talk by lan Riseley OAM, Past President of Rotary International speaks on the *Power of Volunteerism*





In 2018 there were a total of 33 cases of Wild Polio virus worldwide in 2 countries (Pakistan and Afghanistan). Unfortunately, this year there are already 66 cases in the same two countries. Fighting on the borders in some areas and suspicion has hindered the distribution of the vaccine and administration to children. Some good news is that Nigeria hasn't had a case in nearly 3 years and is about to be declared polio free. This will mean the entire African continent will be Polio free. This is a cause for celebration.

To help support the Polio eradication efforts Rotary must ensure the efforts are continued as long as needed. We started this campaign over 30 years ago and will see it through to completion. We also need to ensure that the public know of our great efforts to eradicate Polio.

Our District is planning two events in October to raise awareness and funds for the End Polio Now campaign.

❖ Polio Walk around Albert Park Lake Saturday 19 October commencing at 10am. Please join us for a 5km walk, quick or slow, all the way or part of the way. Everyone is welcome. Red End Polio Now t-shirts will be available to wear. We hope to have a few hundred Rotarians joining the walk. What an impact we will have.


