Guest Speakers

Damien introduced Barry and Jenni Mitchell from Conversations for the Curious (C4C)

These conversations are a sharing of information and knowledge, a dialogue, rather than a lecture, for people who have a thirst for discussing things that matter in their lives. Some examples are education and community building, political awareness, environmental awareness, health – mental and physical, grief and loss, indigenous reconciliation, refugees and asylum seekers. Topics are chosen from ideas from members. They meet on Fridays during school terms from 10am to 12.15pm at the Seniors building in Ferguson St, Williamstown.

The conversations begin with people sitting in a circle – the preferred format for a discussion. In this supportive environment people are more likely to embrace changes to their beliefs and attitudes and more willing to share their skills and insights. People come to C4C through word of mouth. They have received several grants from the Council of Hobsons Bay. The Council community care bus is available for those isolated and for people with disabilities.

Jenni and Barry have been involved in all-age educational programs, firstly with their own children, then younger adults and now with older adults. They saw the challenges in our society of alienation and loneliness in the older community. They started a pilot program for a discussion group in 2011, based on Geraldine Brooks Boyer lectures (The Idea of Home). Carl Hurwood's mother-in-law, Ella, was one of the first persons to speak. Some of the workshops conducted by C4C have included music therapy for wellbeing, IT support, cooking classes, music and dance.

One of the programs of C4C is the Loom Room, a craft hub where participants pursue their craft with like-minded companions on Wednesdays from 10.30 to 1.30pm. Craft includes, weaving, spinning, crochet, embroidery, quilting, papermaking, felting, basket weaving and making "boomerang" bags (borrow and return). People share their skills and exhibit their work at craft markets and elsewhere.

Guests who have given presentations and shared their skills include the Karen people from Myanmar. These people were refugees who came to Melbourne and established a garden behind Werribee Gardens. They spoke about the weaving techniques in their own country and displayed their home-made looms. Other cultural exchanges include two Japanese women who presented the kimono and how the fabric is woven and the outfit worn.

(After the presentation Damien suggested that there are many community groups in Hobsons Bay that we could work with and encourage partnerships such as C4C and the Message Tree).

An inspirational talk by lan Riseley OAM, Past President of Rotary International speaks on the *Power of Volunteerism*





He and his wife, Juliet, a past district governor, are Major Donors and Bequest Society members of The Rotary Foundation. They live on seven hectares at Moorooduc, where they practice their personal philosophy of sustainable and organic living. They have two children and four grandchildren.

In 2018 there were a total of 33 cases of Wild Polio virus worldwide in 2 countries (Pakistan and Afghanistan). Unfortunately, this year there are already 66 cases in the same two countries. Fighting on the borders in some areas and suspicion has hindered the distribution of the vaccine and administration to children. Some good news is that Nigeria hasn't had a case in nearly 3 years and is about to be declared polio free. This will mean the entire African continent will be Polio free. This is a cause for celebration.

To help support the Polio eradication efforts Rotary must ensure the efforts are continued as long as needed. We started this campaign over 30 years ago and will see it through to completion. We also need to ensure that the public know of our great efforts to eradicate Polio.

Our District is planning two events in October to raise awareness and funds for the End Polio Now campaign.


